1.0 INTRODUCTION

Arkwright Summit Wind Farm, LLC (the Project Sponsor) proposes to construct a wind-powered generating facility in the Town of Arkwright, Chautauqua County, New York. The Project will consist of up to 44 wind turbines with a maximum capacity of between 79.2 and 79.8 megawatts (MW). In addition to the wind turbines, the Project will involve construction of four permanent meteorological towers, a system of gravel access roads, a buried and overhead electrical collection system, an operation and maintenance building, and an interconnection substation facility. The Project will be developed on leased private land in the Towns of Arkwright and Pomfret in Chautauqua County, New York. All wind turbines will be located in the Town of Arkwright. The Project will be constructed in one phase, currently anticipated to commence in 2010 and to finish by the end of 2010.

The Project is subject to review under New York's State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) (New York Environmental Conservation Law § 8) and the regulations that implement it (title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, Part 617 [6NYCRR Part 617]). SEQRA and its regulations identify significant architectural resources as among the elements of the physical environment that shall be considered in assessing the potential impacts of a proposed project. The Town of Arkwright is serving as Lead Agency to conduct a coordinated environmental review under SEQRA. Under SEQRA, the Lead Agency is required to consult with the New York State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) to identify and address potential project impacts to resources of architectural or historical significance, and this document provides technical data in support of that consultation.

The Project is also subject to review under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). The Project Sponsor anticipates applying for a permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in compliance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act for possible construction activities in certain regulated wetlands. Issuance of this permit would constitute a federal undertaking pursuant to Section 106 of the NHPA and would require federal agency consultation with SHPO to assess potential project effect on sites, structures, buildings, and districts that are listed on the National Register of Historic Places or eligible for listing.

1.1 Project Description

The Project will consist of up to 44 wind turbine generators (Vestas V-90 or equivalent wind turbine generators). Each turbine consists of a maximum 80 meter (~262-foot) tall tubular steel tower; a maximum 90 meter (~295-foot) diameter rotor consisting of three composite turbine blades with associated hub, and a nacelle that houses the generator, gearbox, and power train. Each turbine has a maximum height of 125 meters (~410 feet) when one rotor blade is oriented straight up. This height includes the concrete pedestal. A transformer, either located adjacent to each tower base or in the nacelle, raises the voltage of the electricity produced by the turbine generator from roughly 690 volts to 34.5 kilovolts (kV). The Project will include four permanent 80 meter (262-foot) tall meteorological towers, gravel access roads, buried 34.5 kV interconnecting electric cable, an overhead electric power collection line (approximately 4.0 miles long) leading to a new interconnection substation, and an operations and maintenance building. Construction of the Project will also require the development of at least one temporary material laydown/construction staging area.

1.2 Project Location

The proposed Project is located in the Towns of Arkwright and Pomfret, in Chautauqua County approximately 57 miles northeast of Erie, PA, 52 miles southwest of Buffalo, and 24 miles north of Jamestown (Figure 1). All of the turbines will be located in the Town of Arkwright. The Project site, as

defined by the boundary within which Project infrastructure is proposed, includes approximately 5961 acres of leased private land within the Towns of Arkwright and Pomfret. The Project site is roughly bordered by Straight Road to the north, Creek Road/Farrington Hollow Road to the east, CR 72 to the south, and Miller Road/Park Road to the west. The proposed electrical substation will be located in the Town of Pomfret.

The Project vicinity is characterized by flat lands to the north and west that rise to rolling hills as one progresses inland from the lake shore. The population is concentrated in the city of Dunkirk, and the villages of Fredonia, Forestville and Cassadaga. In these locations, buildings are located relatively close together on smaller lots. As one moves away from these population centers, as well as the occasional crossroad settlements like Sheridan and Laona, the buildings are more sparsely scattered over the landscape and evidence of agricultural and recreational uses becomes more apparent.

This report presents the results of an aboveground historic resource survey of those resources with a view of the Project, or within five-miles of it (5-mile ring Area of Potential Effect [APE]) and that are either listed on the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP), previously determined eligible for the NRHP (NRE), or were found to be potentially NRE by the Tetra Tech EC, Inc. (TtEC) staff. This report follows the *New York State Historic Preservation Office Guidelines for Wind Farm Development Cultural Resources Survey Work* (SHPO, 2006) (SHPO Guidelines). Data gathered for inventoried properties are presented within Appendix B. Figure 2 is a map showing locations of inventoried resources.

All work was performed by TtEC architectural historians James Sexton, Ph.D. and James E. Toner, M.A., whose qualifications and experience meet and exceed the Department of the Interior National Park Services Professional Qualifications Standards (36 CFR 61). Dr. Sexton is the senior author of this report. Sydne Marshall PhD, RPA served as Task Director.

1.3 Definition of Project Positive Visual APE

The positive visual APE for the Project was defined by TtEC after conducting a thorough and detailed Visual Resource Assessment (VRA) of the Project (Saratoga, 2007 with data updated in 2008). Following standard VRA practices, and adhering to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Program Policy “Assessing and Mitigating Visual Impacts” (NYSDEC, 2000), TtEC evaluated the potential visibility of the Project for the area within five miles of it, based on a computer model considering topography only, and plotted their findings on a viewshed map. This map illustrates the positive visual APE of the Project (Figure 3).

2.0 METHODS

The research methods implemented for this Project were designed to collect information consistent with the State Historic Preservation Office's prescribed practices as outlined in "Guidelines for Wind Farm Development and Cultural Resources Survey Work" (SHPO, 2006) and were based on a strategy agreed upon with the SHPO Staff at a teleconference held on July 17, 2008. The requirement to perform a preliminary survey within a one-mile ring of the Project was waived based on the SHPO Staff's previous experience with TtEC. Instead, TtEC was permitted to commence with a survey of all properties determined in the field to be potentially NRE that were located within five miles of the project and had a view of it. (Notes of the meeting with SHPO are contained in Appendix A.)

Following definition of the APE through modeling (discussed in Section 1.3), research began with an investigation into the previously documented resources located within the Project's APE. As part of that survey, properties listed in the SHPO's online State Preservation Historical Information Network Exchange (SPHINX database) that are located within the APE were reviewed. This information included all buildings, sites, districts, structures and objects that were listed on the NRHP, listed on the New York State Register of Historic Places (SRHP), or that had been determined by SHPO to be eligible for listing on the NRHP or SRHP. (See Section 3.2) This documentary research was followed by a field survey performed in July and August of 2008.

In the field, TtEC's architectural historians used historic maps, published histories, and visual indicators (such as style, form or foundation materials) to identify and approximately date above-ground resources 50 years of age or older located within the positive visual APE (Figure 3). The TtEC team performed a comprehensive survey along all public streets within the 5-mile ring APE. Data were collected for all buildings judged in the field to be potentially NRE. Field identification and subsequent analysis utilized National Park Service technical guidance and primary source historic documents wherever available. Locational and descriptive data about these resources are presented in the Annotated List of Properties (Appendix B).

At least one or two high-resolution digital photographs were taken for each property. These photographs exceed the National Park Service photograph quality standards of 1600 x 1200 pixels contained in the March 2005 "National Register of Historic Places and National Historic Landmarks Survey Photo Policy Expansion." For report production purposes, resolution was reduced for printed photographs. Digitized versions of these photographs permit greater, "zoom in" examination and will be provided to SHPO on CD. This CD of high-resolution photographs is available to other agencies upon request. Thumbnail photographs for each NRE or NRHP-listed resources are included in Appendix B. The resources are listed in Appendices B by their map numbers and organized by Minor Civil Division.

3.0 BACKGROUND RESEARCH

3.1 Historical Context

Euro-American settlement in the APE began as a result of land speculation at the end of the Revolutionary War. In 1791, Robert Morris purchased four million acres of land from land claims held by Massachusetts, stretching from the Genesee River to the Niagara River. Morris sold the land to a Dutch holding company, the Holland Land Company, and the area became known as the Holland Purchase.

As a first step towards selling their land to settlers, the Holland Land Company commissioned a survey of the property. From March 1798-October 1800 a team of surveyors led by Joseph Ellicott surveyed the purchase, delineated the boundaries of the Seneca Indian Reservations and divided the land into townships, ranges and sections (www2.pcom.net/cjinjod/historian/survey.html). This organizing principle of a grid imposed on the landscape with limited regard for topography can still be seen in the road system of the area, where the majority of roads run either east-west or north-south. The ranges are numbered from east to west while the townships are numbered from south to north. (Thomas, 1871)

In 1802, the entire Holland Purchase, as well as the 500,000 acre Morris Reserve immediately to the east, was split off from Ontario County and renamed Genesee County. The Town of Batavia was also formed at this time and included all of the Holland Purchase. It was both the location for the Holland Company office and designated as the county seat (Landmark Society of Genesee County, 1988). In the 40 years after it was created, Genesee County was repeatedly divided to form all or parts of the counties of Allegany (1806), Niagara (1808), Cattaraugus (1808), Chautauqua (1808), Erie (1821), Monroe (1821), Livingston (1821), Orleans (1824), and Wyoming (1841) (<http://www.rootsweb.com/~nygenesee/index.htm>). In 1804 the Town of Chautauqua was incorporated; it included almost all of the land in the current Chautauqua County.

This large area was soon divided and the Town of Pomfret created in 1808. The new town included all of the townships in the tenth and eleventh ranges and the two northernmost townships in the twelfth range. These areas would ultimately become the current towns of Carroll, Poland, Ellington, Cherry Creek, Villenova, Hanover, Sheridan, Pomfret, Arkwright, Charlotte, Gerry, Ellicott and a part of Busti. It was also at this time that Chautauqua County was created. Since the county was not populous enough to function as a separate entity, it remained part of Genesee County until 1811 (Barris and Barris, 1990).

The creation of Pomfret through the division of Chautauqua set the model for town development in Chautauqua County. Over the next 110 years the area within the county would be repeatedly divided until it reached its current outlines. Only the creation of those towns within the study area will be described here. (A full account of the land divisions in Chautauqua County can be found in *Chautauqua Genealogist* Vol 13, No 3, May 1990.)

The first decades of the 19th century also saw the first Euro-American settlers moving into the area; it was a slow process. Downs notes in his history of New York State, "In 1800 the first wheat was raised in Clarence Hollow, and it was then estimated that but twelve persons were living upon the Holland Purchase" (Downs, 1921).

In many cases, this process involved settlement around nascent industrial sites. Fredonia was first settled along Canadaway Creek, a source of power for saw and gristmills. Similarly, Laona grew up around a mill site first used in 1810 or 11, nearly a decade before the hamlet was

named. (Downs, 1921) Forestville had a similar start, with a saw and grist mill at the center of its early economic growth (Young, 1875).

As settlement in the area increased, further divisions were undertaken. In June of 1812, the Town of Hanover was created in the northeastern corner of the county. It was divided from the 5th and 6th townships in the 10th and eastern half of the 11th ranges in Pomfret. At the same time, the Town of Gerry was created from the land in townships 3 and 4 and ranges 10 and 11 (Barris and Barris, 1990).

In 1821, Stockton was created from Chautauqua; it included Township 4 in Range 12 and strips of land in to the west and south, in Township 4, Range 13 and Township 5 Range 12, respectively. Villenova was organized in 1823. It was taken from the Town of Hanover, and encompasses the 5th township in the 10th range (Barris and Barris, 1990). 1821 was also the year that Fredonia began using the abundant local reserves of natural gas for illumination (Young, 1875).

Land was taken from Pomfret and Hanover in 1827 to create the Town of Sheridan. It included the 6th township in the 11th range except for a small portion in the southeast corner, which was retained by Hanover (Barris and Barris, 1990).

1829 saw the creation of Arkwright, Charlotte, and Cherry Creek. Like Sheridan, Arkwright was created from land taken from two towns, Pomfret and Villenova. It occupies the 5th township in the 11th range, except for a lot in the northwest corner, which remained part of Pomfret. Charlotte was created in the 4th township in the 11th range, land formerly part of Gerry. The 4th township in the 10th range in Ellington (which itself had been divided from Gerry only five years earlier), was taken to create Cherry Creek (Barris and Barris, 1990).

1829 was also the year that the village of Fredonia was incorporated. As the 1829 Burr map shows, the village had become a nexus for transportation routes and a center of manufacturing. Forestville played a similar role on the eastern edge of the study area, and just south of Fredonia, Laona also took advantage of easy access to water power and transportation routes. Downs suggests that the Town of Cassadaga had its beginnings in 1817 or 1818 with the construction of the first of several mills in the area of Cassadaga Lake (Downs, 1921). These do not appear on the 1829 map. Dunkirk had begun to grow up around its harbor, but it was still waiting for the arrival of the railroad to spur its major growth. Elsewhere, few roads traversed the study area and there were few mills and manufactories. Settlers in these areas were engaged, as they would be for many years, in agriculture. In 1849, Forestville's prominence in the county was recognized when it also became an incorporated village.

In 1851 the Erie Railroad was completed to Dunkirk, and the balance of economic power in the county began to shift (Downs, 1921). While Fredonia had been the primary business and manufacturing center in the study area, the railroad gave Dunkirk new leverage, and it quickly prospered. The Town of Dunkirk was created in 1859. The northern portion of Township 6 in Range 12 was taken from the Town of Pomfret to create the town. The erection of the town followed its 1837 establishment as a village within Pomfret. The effect of the railroad can be seen elsewhere in the study area as well. The Town of Forestville expanded away from its traditional center with a series of new house lots around the railroad depot.

Asahel Burnham of Arkwright created a revolution in farming when, in 1861, he established the first cooperative cheese production facility in Arkwright. By pooling the resources of the local

farms Burnham was able to enter cheese production at an industrial level. The model was so successful that he soon opened a similar factory in Sinclairville (Downs, 1921).

Forestville fell victim to a massive fire in 1870 that wiped out much of the village's commercial district. The explosion of a lamp in a store led to a fire causing more than \$100,000 worth of damage (New York Times, 1870). The town's business center took many years to recover.

While Forestville's fortunes faltered, Dunkirk prospered. Taking advantage of its good harbor and the railroad lines running into the area, it grew as a manufacturing center. Among its most important factories was the Brooks Locomotive factory, founded in 1869. By 1875, after a small setback in the panic of 1873, the company was employing 275 people daily. In 1880, the city of Dunkirk was created out of a portion of the Town of Dunkirk.

In 1893, Cherry Creek Village was incorporated out of a portion of the Town of Cherry Creek. Finally, in 1921 the village of Cassadaga was incorporated in 1921.

From 1880-1910 the county experienced its strong population growth, with increases of 15%, 17%, and 19% from census to census. After this, the twentieth century was a period of relative stasis for the area, with less than 10% population growth through the 1960s (with negative growth during World War II). From 1960 on the population of the area has decreased on every census (<http://www.empire.state.ny.us/nysdc/StateCountyPopests/CountyPopHistory.PDF>).

3.2 Previously Documented Properties

The process of surveying historic buildings for wind farm projects is defined by the SHPO (SHPO, 2006). The first step in this process, according to the SHPO guidelines, is as follows:

Using NYSHPO data, the survey will initially identify all buildings/sites within the study area that were previously determined eligible for inclusion in or are already listed in the New York State and National Registers of Historic Places (SHPO, 2006).

What follows is a summary, by municipality, of previously documented NRE and NRHP-listed resources located within the positive visual APE for the Arkwright Summit Project including both the name and/or address of each resource and its SHPO Unique Site Number (USN).

3.2.1 Town of Arkwright (MCD 01301)

Arkwright is located in the center of the APE. The majority of the project elements, including all of the turbines, are proposed to be located in the Town of Arkwright. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Town of Arkwright.

3.2.2 Village of Cassadaga (MCD 01301)

The Village of Cassadaga is located at the western edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Village of Cassadaga. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Village of Cassadaga.

3.2.3 Town of Charlotte (MCD 01301)

The Town of Charlotte is located at the southern edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Town of Charlotte. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Town of Charlotte.

3.2.4 Town of Cherry Creek (MCD 01301)

The Town of Cherry Creek is located at the southeastern edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Town of Cherry Creek. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Town of Cherry Creek.

3.2.5 Village of Cherry Creek (MCD 01301)

The Village of Cherry Creek is located at the southeastern edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Village of Cherry Creek. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Village of Cherry Creek.

3.2.6 City of Dunkirk (MCD 01301)

The City of Dunkirk is located at the northwestern edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the City of Dunkirk. One NRE property was previously documented within the APE in the City of Dunkirk:

3.2.7 Town of Dunkirk (MCD 01301)

The Town of Dunkirk is located at the northwestern edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Town of Dunkirk. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Town of Dunkirk.

3.2.8 Village of Forestville (MCD 01352)

The Village of Forestville is located at the northeastern edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Village of Forestville. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Village of Forestville.

3.2.9 Village Fredonia (MCD 01342)

The Village Fredonia is located at the northwestern edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Village Fredonia. Twenty-six properties are currently listed on the NR and 68 NRE properties, including 58 properties in the proposed East Main Street Historic District, were previously documented within the APE in the Village Fredonia:

3.2.13 Town of Stockton (MCD 01325)

The Town of Stockton is located at the southwestern edge of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Town of Stockton. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Town of Stockton.

3.2.14 Town of Villenova (MCD 01326)

The Town of Villenova is located in the eastern part of the APE. No elements of the project are proposed by the Project Sponsor for the Town of Villenova. No NRHP-listed or NRE properties were previously documented in the portion of the APE located within the Town of Villenova.

4.0 HISTORIC ARCHITECTURAL SURVEY RESULTS

4.1 Observed Trends Within the APE

Survey within the APE revealed three distinct settlement patterns as well as a variety of different building styles.

4.1.1 Urban Areas

The northwestern edge of the APE includes a portion of the City of Dunkirk. This predominantly residential area has a distinctive dense grid of streets filled with closely spaced building on relatively small lots. In addition, several industrial complexes are included in the area.

4.1.2 Villages

The APE contains all or substantial parts of four villages. Three of these, Cassadaga, Forestville, and Fredonia are incorporated. The fourth, Sheridan, is not. (The APE includes a short stretch of one street in the incorporated village of Cherry Creek. So little of that community is represented in the survey – there were no historic buildings in the APE – that it is not discussed here.) These represent a variety of different settlement types and patterns. Fredonia began along Canadaway Creek but expanded around a man-made feature, Barker Common. A series of streets radiate from this central place, often with smaller streets branching off perpendicular to these main roads. Cassadaga and Sheridan are both examples of cross roads settlements. In the case of Sheridan, the community did not expand beyond this arrangement, while Cassadaga grew to include a series of streets around Cassadaga Lake, a natural feature that helped the community serve as a resort for a period of time. It continues to host the Lily Dale Spiritualist Assembly. (Only a small portion of Lily Dale sits within the APE.)

4.1.3 Agricultural Areas

The majority of the area within the 5-mile ring is agricultural or rural. In these areas, widely scattered buildings, often with agricultural outbuildings or evidence of these buildings, dot the landscape. The upland areas tend to support the raising of cattle and dairying while the more level portions of the APE are used for raising crops, frequently grapes. While some buildings have been replaced or abandoned, infill structures added, and some of the land is no longer under cultivation, the area outside the villages gives a clear indication of its long and continuing history of use for agriculture. The importance of agricultural activities is emphasized by the presence of several Grange buildings, including the first Grange in the country located in Fredonia.

4.2 Architectural Findings

Within the APE, a number of architectural styles were observed, including Federal (ca. 1790-1830), Greek Revival (ca. 1830-1860), Italianate (ca. 1840-1885), Gothic Revival (ca. 1845-1880), Second Empire (ca. 1860-1880), Queen Anne (ca. 1880-1910), Colonial Revival (ca. 1880-1955), Craftsman/Bungalow (ca. 1900-1930), as well as vernacular end or side gable buildings (ca. 1820-1920), and a single Modern office building (ca. 1945-present). The specific descriptions of these architectural styles and building types, including typical character-defining features, have been described in greater detail within standard architectural history guides (including Virginia and Lee McAlister's *Field Guide to American Houses*). Historic cemeteries were also recorded during the survey.

The APE includes a number of notable surviving examples of the above-noted styles and types. [References to specific structures are noted in the following discussion by Map Point number. Buildings are also arranged in Appendix B – Annotated List of Properties by this number.]

Federal Style (ca. 1790-1830). The Federal style, with its classically derived ornament and attenuated decorative features, is represented by very few buildings within the APE. The clearest

example of this style is the three bay house at 28 Main St., Forestville (Map Point 47), which has an elliptical fanlight in the flushboarded tympanum of its gable and egg-and-dart moldings in the entablature.

Greek Revival (ca. 1830-1860). Greek Revival buildings are well represented in the APE. The most complete examples of the style's classically inspired elements are three houses in Fredonia designed by local architect John Jones: 403 East Main St. (Map Point 242), 63 Risley St. (Map Point 116) and 89 Risley St (Map Point 82). These houses demonstrate Jones's facility with the idiom, incorporating many of the features which appeared in the pattern books of the day. While these are the most elaborate examples, a number of simpler versions of the style were found throughout the area in a variety of materials.

Italianate (ca. 1840-1885). The Italianate style is represented in the area by a large number of houses. 225 E. Main St., Fredonia (Map Point 238), 1 Center St., Forestville (Map Point 59), and 25 Main St., Forestville (Map Point 50). All three of these buildings contain the low pitched roof, deep overhangs, and tall windows that are characteristic of the style. These buildings also demonstrate the style's flexibility – they include building in both wood and brick as well as domestic and commercial structures – and its popularity. Along with the Greek Revival and Queen Anne, Italianate is one of the most frequently used styles in the APE.

Gothic Revival (ca. 1845-1880). The APE contains several buildings which reflect the Gothic Revival style. 39 Forest Place, Fredonia (Map Point 91) and 3521 Route 20, Sheridan (Map Point 8), both contain the character defining elements of the style.

Second Empire (ca. 1860-1880). A number Second Empire buildings were found within the APE. However, the William H. Greene house, 57 Central Ave., Fredonia, (Map Point 158) is an outstanding example. It retains its mansard roofs, belvedere, round-headed dormers, and molded cornice with brackets.

Queen Anne (ca. 1880-1910). Queen Anne was a relatively popular style within the APE. Examples of buildings in this style appear with hipped roofs and lower cross gables at 9453 and 9460 Rte. 60 in Pomfret (Map Points 283 and Map Point 284), cross gables at 49 Eagle St., Fredonia (Map Point 118) or simple gable front arrangements at 2730 Route 20, Sheridan (Map Point 27). In all cases, decorative features – including bay windows, gable ornaments, and even a tower -- were used to enliven the facades.

Colonial Revival (ca. 1880-1955). The APE contains only a few Colonial Revival buildings. Two examples can be seen along Central Avenue in Fredonia: one in wood at 193 Central Ave. (Map Point 276) and one in brick at 104 Central Ave. (Map Point 173).

Tudor Revival (1890-1940). There is only a small number of Tudor Revival buildings in the APE. However, 221 Central Ave., Fredonia (Map Point 184) is a rich example that includes many allusions to English antecedents including half-timbered sections, bargeboards, diamond-pane casement windows, and a prominent chimney.

Craftsman/Bungalow (ca. 1900-1930). The Craftsman Style is also sparsely represented in the district. The structure at 3230 South Roberts Rd., Sheridan (Map Point 13), includes such character defining decorative elements as a shed dormer, a deep porch under the slope of the main roof which is supported on large square piers, and deep overhangs.

Modern(1920-1960). Several buildings in the APE can be characterized as having been designed in the modern style. Fenton and Gregory Halls on the SUNY Fredonia Campus (Map Points 122 and 183) demonstrate the streamlined Colonial Revival design idiom that was popularized for governmental and institutional buildings. 44 Temple Street, Fredonia (Map Point 141) is similarly stylized, although in this case its referents are more abstracted. Finally, 8730 Brigham Rd., in the city of Dunkirk (Map Point 3) is the only example of an International style office building in the APE.

Vernacular Buildings (ca. 1820-1920). Many of the buildings within the APE lack the style markers of the structures described above and may simply be characterized as vernacular structures. Most of these were simpler versions of the high style structures described above, employing similar massing or plans but lacking the decorative details that distinguish the more elaborate buildings in the area. For example, a number of buildings employed the Greek Revival building gable front and wing form without using a classical entablature or other decorative elements.

Proposed Historic Districts. Two groups of buildings are proposed as potential NRE Historic Districts: the Central Avenue Fredonia District includes 17-109 Central Ave. (Map Points 146-151 and 153-176) and the Sheridan District includes 2754-2696 Rte. 20, Sheridan (Map Points 20-31 and 33-38). The Fredonia District is a collection of well-preserved high-style buildings from the second half of the 19th century that demonstrate the mercantile success of Fredonia's residents. The proposed historic district in Sheridan demonstrates the area's settlement patterns, where small villages grew up around crossroads in the agricultural areas of the APE. In this case, Sheridan prospered because of its location on the road to Buffalo. The buildings within the proposed district are built in a variety of styles popular in the period from the end of the Civil War to the end of World War I.

5.0 ASSESSMENT OF IMPACTS

The APE includes those historic properties within five miles of Arkwright Summit Wind Farm that may have a view of the Project. All of the Town of Arkwright and Villages of Fredonia and Forestville along with portions of the Towns of Charlotte, Cherry Creek, Dunkirk, Hanover, Pomfret, Sheridan, Stockton, and Villanova, the Villages of Cassadaga, Cherry Creek, Fredonia and Forestville, and the City of Dunkirk fall within a 5-mile ring of the Project. Within the APE are 100 buildings, structures or cemeteries previously listed in or determined eligible for the NRHP. Many of these resources are included in three NRHP listed or previously determined eligible Historic Districts. This report is recommending an additional 184 resources as potentially eligible to the NRHP, including two proposed Historic Districts.

5.1 Visual Impacts to National Register Listed or Eligible Properties

As the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's program policy on assessing and mitigating visual impacts indicates, more than visibility is required to conclude that a project will result in an adverse effect on a resource: "A project, by virtue of its visibility, must clearly interfere with or reduce the public's enjoyment and/or appreciation of the appearance of an inventoried resource" (NYSDEC, 2000). The challenge in assessing the impact of a project lies in interpreting the effect that various limiting factors have on the visual intrusiveness of the project on specific resources. For the architectural resources inventoried for this project, three major visual assessment factors were considered in assessing project impacts: the distance of the resource from the nearest element of the Project, the orientation of the resource, and the existence of both seasonal vegetation and man-made landscape features that screen the view of project elements.

5.1.1 *Distance*

A number of studies have attempted to quantify the common sense understanding of how distance affects the visual impact of man-made features in the landscape. These studies have tried to identify the point at which man-made elements become background features in a landscape and are therefore less intrusive in the view of a historic resource. While there is some variation on the exact distance at which this happens, there is general agreement that large man-made landscape features begin to be less apparent at about 3.5 miles. This consensus forms the basis for the U.S. Forest Service's "distance zones" used to determine the visual affect of large man-made objects in the landscape (USFS, 1973).

Recent scholarship has narrowed this focus specifically to the visual impact of wind turbines. For the purposes of this report 3.7 miles (6 km), taken from studies of the visual impact specifically of wind turbines in the United Kingdom, is used as the point at which turbines have a diminished impact on historic resources (Berry et al., 1998; Eyre, 1995). Figures 2-4 show the location of the recorded resources within three distance zones (foreground, 0-2 miles; middleground, 2-3.7 miles; background, 3.7-5 miles) based on the location of the nearest Project element. Applying this assessment methodology, the Project will not be visually prominent when viewed from more than 3.7 miles (6km) (Berry et al., 1998). Their data suggest the Project will have a limited effect on 163 properties – the majority of the properties identified by this study – as they lie more than 3.7 miles from the Project.

5.1.2 *Orientation*

Another factor that was considered in weighing the impact of the project on historic resources was the orientation of the resource relative to the project and public rights-of-way. If a privately-owned historic resource is oriented in such a way that a project component is not included in

views of the main façade of the resource from the nearest public right-of-way, then the project is considered to have a limited impact on the resource. For those resources which are generally open to the public, such as cemeteries, the view from the resource was also considered. A desk-top analysis of the data collected in the field and the viewshed model was undertaken to get a rough sense of which properties might be oriented in such a way that a view of both the resource and the project was unlikely. Looking at head-on views of the main façade of a structure from the nearest public right-of-way and the relative location of the project it is estimated that the effect of the Project on 126 resources will be limited by their location and orientation.

5.1.3 Screening

As with orientation, if a view of Project elements and historic resources is not possible, in this case because it is interrupted by seasonal vegetation, then the impact of the Project on the historic resource will be diminished. The *SHPO Guidelines* indicate the APE for a wind project should be defined based on a topography-only viewshed. This allows for as comprehensive as possible a survey of the potentially affected area. However, since most of the APE is wooded, it overestimates the number of properties from which the Project will be visible, and the number of turbines that will be visible from any single property (see Table 1). Figure 4 shows the viewshed of the property when the screening affect of vegetation is considered (see Table 1). It is likely that at least 68 of the surveyed resources will be screened from views of the Project for at least part of the year.

The results of analyzing the documented resources using these visual assessment factors, distance, orientation and screening, are summarized in Table 1.

5.2 Conclusions

284 properties, including resources listed on, determined eligible for, or recommended as potentially eligible for the National Register of Historic Places may have views of the Project. (All of these resources also appear in Appendix B of this report.) While none of the Project impact assessment factors described above will completely eliminate the overall impact of the Project, they may minimize it to the point that it falls below the threshold of being judged an adverse effect for specific properties, especially in cases where resources are buffered by several of these factors. This is the case for 78 properties, where each of these resources is both more than 3.7 miles from the nearest Project element and is oriented in such a way that the project and resource cannot be included in the same view (Table 1). Similarly, 49 resources are located more than 3.7 miles from the project and are expected to be screened from views of it by seasonal vegetation. Finally, 22 resources are located more than 3.7 miles from the project, and are oriented so that their main façade and the project will not be visible in a view from the nearest public right of way, and are expected to be screened from the Project by seasonal vegetation.

6.0 AVOIDANCE AND MITIGATION

The Project will impact the rural and suburban visual settings associated with some the inventoried properties, although that impact will be limited on some properties by the distance, screening and orientation factors mentioned above. While introducing forty-four 410-foot tall, kinetic structures into the Town of Arkwright will change the essentially rural and suburban character of the surrounding area, existing land uses can continue. The visual impact of the proposed wind turbines within the APE will vary by location, both by number of turbines visible and the distance at which they are visible.

6.1 Avoidance

During the design process, the Applicant analyzed a number of different layouts for the Project, including minimizing and, ideally, avoiding impacts to cultural and ecological resources identified in the field. This resulted in site adjustments and, in some cases, elimination of proposed wind turbines. In the current design, 284 NRHP-listed, NRE or potentially NRE properties may have at least a partial view of elements of the Project. This is a reduction of six potentially NRE properties with a view of the project when compared to the previous design iteration. Since the primary siting priority for the proposed wind turbines is to maximize the use of the available wind resources (often found on higher ground) to generate electricity, decreasing the number of turbines and re-siting them can result in diminishing the viability of the project. While the site layout refinements have resulted in impacts to fewer cultural resources it is not possible to create a viable design that has no impact on cultural resources within the Project APE. However, it is worth noting that most of the affected areas are more than 3.7 miles from the nearest turbine and therefore the Project will likely have a minimal effect on those properties.

6.2 Mitigation

Because of the topography of the area, the scattered locations of the affected resources, and the various visibility factors that influence the effect of the Project on these individual resources, it is difficult to implement visual impact mitigation measures for each specific property. Based on the collective impact to these properties within the APE, the applicant will provide specific mitigation measures that reflect local historic preservation priorities for identified historic properties and/or the overall historic landscape within the APE for consideration by the lead agency. Based on lead agency consultation with the SHPO, USACE and interested local parties, the applicant will work with the lead agency to develop a proposed mitigation plan that can be undertaken to offset the impact of the Project on NRHP-listed and NRE properties within the APE.

Tetra Tech EC, Inc. (TtEC) is under contract to New Grange Wind Farm, LLC (New Grange), a Delaware subsidiary of Horizon Wind Energy LLC, to assist in permitting the proposed New Grange Wind Farm Project (Project). New Grange anticipates that it will apply for a Section 404 Permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. In addition, the Project will be reviewed under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA). The Town of Arkwright will be the Lead Reviewing Agency.

Project Description

New Grange is proposing to develop a wind-powered generating facility of up to 47 wind turbines with a maximum capacity of 79.9 megawatts (MW). In addition to the wind turbines, the Project will involve construction of four permanent meteorological towers, a system of gravel access roads, a buried and overhead electrical collection system, an operation and maintenance building, and an interconnection substation facility.

The Project will be constructed in one phase, currently anticipated to commence in 2008 and to finish by the end of 2009, with some preliminary clearing potentially occurring in fall 2008.

Historical Architecture Issues



A historical architecture study that will comply with the New York State Historic Preservation Office Guidelines for Wind Farm Development Cultural Resources Survey Work is in the process of being planned. 


